

WHAT IS THE COVID 19 SITUATION AT ECS PORT REGIS?

ECS courses take place in the South West of England, an area that has reported the lowest number of COVID 19 cases in the UK throughout the pandemic.

HOW IS ECS ABLE TO MANAGE COVID 19?

- ECS is set in 150 acres of parkland in the county of Dorset. Our rural location combined with a smaller number of pupils allows us to maximise individual space.
- ECS has a team of dedicated boarding staff with support from the local Doctors' Surgery in Shaftesbury. The school has easy access to two local hospitals.

HOW WILL STUDENTS BE KEPT SAFE IN SCHOOL?

- The Directors will oversee all practical and operational aspects of keeping the school community safe.
- ECS has committed to the Young Learners COVID Safe checklist. See below
- 'Whole school' gatherings will not happen until it is safe to gather in larger groups. Until then the school will work within it's own age group bubbles.
- We will make the most of our space to allow for social distancing (outside of bubbles) throughout the day, including various one-way routes.
- Meals will have staggered timings as well as separate areas of the dining room to allow pupils to socially distance in their bubbles. The school caterers will apply all appropriate guidelines as communicated by Public Health England.
- We will ensure that the location and times of breaks are staggered to allow smooth movement around the site.
- Visitors may be allowed by prior arrangement with the Directors. They
 will have their temperature checked on arrival and will leave current
 contact details.

HOW WILL THE AGE GROUPS BE KEPT SAFE?

- We are fortunate in having three separate boarding houses, which, together with separate courses for each age group, enable us to create 'bubbles' for each age group.
- Each boarding house will therefore form a bubble with their own House Parents, Teachers and Activity Staff.
- Deep cleaning of all spaces will take place on a regular basis.
- All students will have their temperature checked each morning before leaving the house and on return in the evening.
- Staff will be trained in the safe management of the houses under the new guidance.

GENERAL PREPARATION AND PLANNING

- We have completed a full risk assessment in preparation for the arrival of our students, which we will continue to update as the situation develops. Updates will be shared on the school website.
- Fire drills under social distancing procedures have been planned and we will conduct a drill at the start of each course.
- Laundry will be managed hygienically and safely onsite.
- Visitor protocol is being adapted to minimise contact with people from outside the school.

COVID-19 Checklist for Young Learner Schools

Please note that COVID regulations are ever changing and this advice is valid at the time of writing (October 2020).

Things to consider before opening your school:

You have carried out a deep-clean of all indoor spaces including classrooms, bedrooms, kitchens and bathrooms.

You have current government guidelines* to hand in the instance that a student of staff member shows symptoms.

You have evaluated and adapted your medical procedures to ensure compliance with the recommendations of public health bodies such as Public Health England**.

You have produced your own COVID related risk assessments and continue to monitor and update them in accordance with government guidelines.

You are aware of and comply with English UK's COVID-19 guidelines***.

You have applied for Visit Britain's free UK-wide industry standard and consumer mark to reassure your customers that your business adheres to Government and public health guidance****.

You have substitution procedures in place should a member of staff have symptoms, has tested positive or has been in contact with someone showing symptoms (within the last 14 days). The utmost care must also be taken to ensure that any staff showing symptoms do not have contact with students.

You have a suitable isolation area to care for students who show symptoms and/or test positive.

You have trained staff and host families in regards to the safe management of accommodation following current guidance and school procedures.

Parents, guardians and agents have been informed of your school's COVID related policies.

Things to consider before students leave home:

Students, their family, their guardians and their agents have been informed of arrival procedures and any questions that they may have been answered. This information must include procedures at the airport, transport to school and quarantine procedures if necessary.

Students, their family, their guardians and their agents have been provided with written information on arrival, at school procedures, including any information on non-students entering the building, i.e. parents, agents, etc.

Students, their family, their guardians and their agents must be provided with emergency contact details including a 24 hour emergency telephone number.

Students have been advised to bring at least 3 reusable masks with them.

Things to consider when students arrive in the country:

The student is met by a named person who is aware of, and follows, appropriate social distancing guidance.

The student is aware that we cannot shake hands and that appropriate protection will be worn when handling luggage, etc.

The named person is wearing a face covering at all times when in proximity to the student in enclosed areas, especially in vehicles unless screens are provided.

The journey to school is direct, the vehicle contains sanitiser and suitable wipes, and any required toilet stops are conducted in accordance with relevant safety guidelines.

Things to consider when students arrive at school:

Students are immediately informed of, and understand, your school's COVID procedures including routines and arrangements.

Students have the opportunity to discuss their fears, worries and concerns with a trusted adult.

Things to consider during the course:

Students and staff adhere to appropriate social distancing in all areas of school.

You have adequate hand washing facilities which are constantly stocked with soap and paper towels.

Students and staff are washing their hands regularly.

Hand washing facilities and hand sanitiser is readily available in key areas of your school.

Students and staff are aware that they may raise any concerns.

Students and staff are aware of any laundry procedures.	
Staff are provided with the necessary protection that they may need.	
Housekeeping staff carry out a thorough cleaning of accommodation, communal and all school areas regularly	
and are provided with any necessary protection.	
Students and staff have the opportunity to wear a mask whenever they deem necessary (e.g. while on transport,	
inside communal areas, queuing for the dining room, etc.) unless during activities when it may not be necessary.	
You have information boards/screens clearly displaying procedures such as COVID risk assessments, rules, mask	
wearing and social distancing.	
The number of staff and students in areas such as classrooms, dining rooms, bedrooms and bathrooms, etc.	
should be monitored so as to ensure social distancing.	
Any academic, activity, etc. equipment should not be shared between students unless appropriate safety	
measures have been implemented.	
Students and staff have access to indoor and outdoor spaces for recreation and capacity should be monitored in	
order to ensure social distancing.	
Temperature checks should be performed as and when necessary on students, staff and visitors.	
Students and staff should be made aware that any pandemic related bullying will not be tolerated.
